Our Town 2024 budget is largely in place. The annual challenges of coming up with a reasonable budget only increase. On one end of the budget teeter-totter are responsibilities, the other, resources. In the centre, council with administration, are required to build a balanced budget. This means allocating limited funds to always expanding costs, daily necessities and future needs. Providing essential services, repair and replacement of facilities, equipment, streets, and computers, managing debt load, setting wages, and so on... These requirements all the while are dependent on having sufficient municipal revenues to pay for priorities.

How to pay for ever increasing municipal responsibilities is one topic to be discussed at the upcoming Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association conference. I've been invited to be on a panel discussion along with others including Professor Enid Slack from the University of Toronto who has thought extensively about the role of property taxes, their shortfalls, and alternative municipal revenue sources, no easy solutions to this challenge, but a worthy conversation to be part of both now, and for future council leadership for our wonderful Town.

 - Meal and Travel Expense, and
 - Council Indemnities.
